# SELECTION AND EVALUATION OF APPLICATIONS REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATION

#### 1. Requirements for the application.

Students shall submit the application online on the website:

http://mobint.uniroma2.it/erasmus/candidatura/Default.aspx, by 28 February 2020, at 12 pm.

BA and MA students will have to:

- 1) verify that information on the website DELPHI are up to date and correct; in cases of doubt, please contact the Help Desk (using the icon on the page);
- 2) scan and/or type on the on-line application form the following information:
  - matriculation number:
  - IBAN code registered to the student;
  - passport or identity card number;
  - self-certification of the Bachelor's degree final mark.

Wrong on-line application forms received after the above deadline and/or whose data will be considered incomplete or false according to the indications above WILL NOT be taken into account

Before submitting the application form, students can ask for information concerning the filling out of the form and other details at the Erasmus Office of the Macroarea di Lettere e Filosofia (Building A, floor -1, room 05).

Starting from the academic year 2016/2017, the recognition of the exams takes place for credits' sets "ECTS-CFU" (*pacchetto esami*) according to the definition of the Bologna Italian Experts (<a href="http://www.processodibologna.it/">http://www.processodibologna.it/</a>). In order to create this package (*pacchetto esami*), students must comply with the following indications:

- Students abroad for one year must obtain at least **24 ECTS-CFU** and besides they may also gain further credits within the maximum allowed credits on their study plan. Students abroad for one semester must obtain at least **12 ECTS-CFU** and besides they may also gain further credits within the maximum allowed credits on their study plan. In the case the students do not gain the above mentioned number of credits, the University will not pay the E.U. contribution and will require the returning of any funding possibly given in advance.



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- Furthermore, the Macroarea committee will evaluate individual cases, such as the mobility for degree's thesis, upon a written request by the student. Advanced students who are going to graduate and PhD students who have already got the total credits of their course of study are not asked to get further credits

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- Acquisition ofcredits:
- Students must obtain in the host University 2/3 of ECTS-CFU of the equivalent subject (examples: 8 ECTS- CFU for 12 ECTS-CFU, 4 ECTS-CFU for 6 ECTS-CFU, etc.). The remaining ECTS-CFU credits may be gained in the host University in subjects which are similar to the scientific sector of the subject, in order to avoid further integrations of the exam. Nevertheless, the students, under the supervision of the Delegate of the international mobility, have to find and follow the courses of the equivalent subject for the specific ones in the host University with the same amount of ECTS corresponding to Tor Vergata University's courses. If it is not possible, students who obtain only 2/3 of the ECTS requested, and not the totality of them, must follow the instructions of the Delegates of each Degree course (for LLEM & LLEA Delegates for International mobility of the linguistic areas) in order to gain credits in similar subjects. The delegate will consider the appropriated activities for the Learning Agreement if, due to the deletion of courses at the host University or to possible problems for the admission to courses with a limited number of students, it is difficult to identify similar or corresponding subjects.
- For calculating credits in the Italian and foreign sets ("pacchetti"), other activities (LAB, stages, language courses and activities permitted by the Degree courses) with corresponding credits may be considered and recognized These activities must be indicated in the Learning Agreement before the departure.

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#### 2. Language requirements.

It is essential for the students a certified knowledge of the language(s) of the destination country or of the language accepted by the host University as "learning language". The Programme is developed on the base of bilateral/multilateral agreements signed between the home and host Universities that expect specifically a linguistic competence level (A1, A2, B1, B2, C1, C2). According to these agreements, the host University could not accept the students with a lowlevel of linguage knowledge, even after grant allocation. Application forms regarding the German area of the courses LLEM e LINFO may be submitted starting from the second year by students who obtained a minimum of 10 ECTS in German language or who have a document certifying at least a B1 level of languages skill ("Zertifikat Deutsch"); first year students may submit their application only if they have the above –mentioned document for a B1 level.

Before the deadline for the presentation of the *application form*, whose deadline is different depending on the selected host University, the student will have to demonstrate an adequate knowledge of the language(s) of the country of the destination, or of the possible "learning language" established by the agreement with the host University. For this purpose, the student must **deliver to the Erasmus Office of the Macroarea** appropriate documentation, otherwise, the student will lose the allocated Erasmus grant.

The agreement may require a "certificate" or an "attestation" (in both cases provided by institutions or authorities which are qualified for that purpose) for the language knowledge level.

If the Agreement imposes a certificate, some examples of the most recognized certificates (without any intention of completeness) are the following:

If the agreement requires the "attestation", the University will proceed with the recognition of the level of language skill according to one of the following requirements:

- **attestation** granted by an accredited school at a national and/or international level, with indications of the level that you have achieved (A1, A2, B1, B2, C1, C2);
- ➤ a qualifying examination that you have passed at the CLA (Centro Linguistico di Ateneo di Tor Vergata) with indications of the level that you have achieved (A1, A2, B1, B2, C1,C2);

#### Only for the students of the Degrees LINFO/LLEM and LLEA:

- the achievement of 10/12 20/24 credits in the reference language which will be certified by the CLA (Centro Linguistico di Ateneo) according to the respective equivalence of the level that the study courses have established;
- ➤ a certified stay abroad for at least 4 months for reasons of studying or working (such as LLP/Erasmus or other mobility projects the office establishes a B1level \*);
- > a written declaration by the student that the reference language is his/her mother tongue (the office establishes a C2level \*);
- > a certificate which expired less than four years (see above) indicating the level that you have obtained;
- > enrollment to courses of this University in English (for example Pharmacy, Medicine, etc. the office establishes a B2level \*)

If the student has no documentation of the language knowledge within the terms established by the host University, or if his/her documentation is incomplete or false, the allocation of the grant will be cancelled, and the next student who comes in the ranking will replace the other student.

An important innovation introduced by the Programme, compared to the previous European programmes, is that Erasmus+ strengthens the support offered to participants to the mobility activities in order to improve their knowledge of the foreign languages before and after the stay abroad. Since 2016 the European service of Online Linguistic Support (OLS) has been launched gradually. This service gives an opportunity to the participants to the mobility Programme to evaluate their knowledge of the foreign language, and also to attend a language course online freely in order to improve their skills. Furthermore, students who want to participate in the Erasmus+ programme can attend language courses organized by the CLA (Centro Linguistico di Ateneo).

<sup>\*</sup> Attestations won't be granted to the students. A value is conferred for internal use for the sole purpose of the submission of the application.



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#### 3. Ranking-lists creation and grantsassignation

Ranking-lists will be divided by Degree Course or groups of similar Courses. As regards Courses in Modern Languages and Literatures (LLEM), Languages in the Information Society (LINFO) and European and American Languages and Literatures (LLEA), lists will be divided by linguistic area of destination.

As regards **Bachelor's Degree students**, only exams taken (and passed) within **December 31<sup>st</sup>**, **2019** will be considered valid for lists creation. Only for first-year students, also exams passed within the end of the first semester (winter session) will be considered valid.

For Master's Degree or Specialist Degree students, the final score will be calculated based on the Bachelor's Degree final mark (expressed in thirtieths, namely final mark \* 3/11, plus 4 additional points for who graduated with honours. Credits obtained with Bachelor's Degree are 180)

and on marks of the exams taken during the Master's Degree Course passed within **December 31<sup>st</sup>**, **2019**. Similarly to Bachelor's Degree students, for Master's Degree students enrolled in the first year exams taken within the end of the first semester (winter session) will be calculated. For pass-lists creation, the final score will be calculated by processing the following statistical indexes:

- **1. Filter index (Index A)**: the score is calculated based on the number of exams taken. If the number of applications exceeds the available grants, only students who obtained at least 60% (sixty percent) of the credits expected for the relevant year and course will beadmitted;
- 2. Index of average mark (Index B): the score is based on the average mark weighted with credits (obtained by multiplying each mark by the related credits and adding up the resulting figures. The result will be divided by the total credits obtained by thestudent);
- 3. Diligence index (Index C): it is a corrective index that will affect the final score by subtracting a maximum of two points to students who did not obtain the total number of progressive credits provided for their year of attendance. The year of attendance will be calculated starting from the year ofenrolment.



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#### Please note that:

- 1) To calculate marks, a full mark ("30 e lode") equals to31;
- 2) Students of the old university system (*vecchio ordinamento*), which did not contemplate any credit award system, will gain 10 credits for each passed exam;
- 3) for exams that provide separate marks for the written and oral parts (i.e. language exams), only the total credits of the two parts provided for the ongoing year shall be considered.

The ranking-list, once considered Index A, shall be created based on the score resulting from the following formula: Final mark = B-C. Besides, if the Erasmus call is reopened, students can submit applications for possible remaining grants for their study course.

If the host University agrees to accept students of different courses from the one indicated in the agreement, students of English Studies of the courses LLEM, LINFO and LLEA may submit their application for using possible remaining grants for Universities where the language required is English.

Please note that it will be the responsibility of students to preliminarily verify the availability in the foreign University of courses provided by their study plan (particularly English language, English Literature and/or Anglo American Literature).

Interested Students will submit a copy of their study programme when the call is opened again.

**Provisional pass-lists will be published within March 2020.** Possible clarifications or appeals about the result of the evaluation will be proposed at the Erasmus Office (Macroarea Lettere e Filosofia) at 12.00 in the 7<sup>th</sup>day after the announcement of the provisional pass-list.

**Presentation of the host Universitues (by mid-March):** there will be orientation meetings with the participation of students who have already lived studies and Erasmus experiences, in the previous academic years.

#### The publication of the final pass-lists and grants assignation will take place within the end of March 2020.

The called students will declare in that place the grant acceptance, otherwise, the grant will be lost; according to the order of the pass-list, students will choose the University among the available ones and they will specify the duration of their stay abroad, opting for a semester or a year, when the options are possible. If a winner student gives up the grant, there will be a new grants assignation, obviously following the pass-list.

During the meeting about Erasmus+ mobility grants assignation, the student will sign the preliminary acceptance module. Later on the procedure about the on-line signature of the final contract will be communicated. Please note that the students who cannot come to the grant assignation meeting can be represented with a signed authorization and with a copy of their ID card.

# Learning Agreement and recognition of exams passed abroad:

Before departure, students who were assigned an Erasmus grant will complete procedures for enrolment in the host University within the deadline



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provided by each University. Under the supervision of the Delegate for International mobility of his/her course (for LLEM & LLEA Delegates for International mobility of the linguistic areas), the students will choose the courses he/she intends to attend at the foreign University. Each exam will be planned taking into account the student's workload required for the course attendance, the preparation of essays and the programme as the whole. However, the exam can be approved on the basis of the number of hours of lessons, if there is not a correspondence between ECTS-CFU of a Tor Vergata course and the Host University (as stipulated Senate's resolution of 26.6.16).

Furthermore, students shall also fill in two copies of the Learning Agreement, signed by the Delegate for International Mobility as shown in the schedule of the Degree Courses (see following pages).

The forms will have to be handed over to the Erasmus office of the Faculty.

Information on courses held at partner Universities is available on the websites listed below.

**During his/her stay abroad**, if the student cannot attend the courses agreed upon with the Delegate for international mobility, he/she will agree with him/her possible changes which will be notified via email to the Erasmus office of the Faculty of Humanities along with the Delegate's authorization. The changes will have to be reported on the Learning Agreement and signed by the aforementioned Delegates within the time of each Degree courses.

For reasons of clarity, please fill out your learning agreement by PC and NOT manually.

After the mobility period, the exams taken and passed in the EU host Universities will be recognized as equivalent to our University's on the basis of the Learning Agreement. Marks given to the exams will be converted according to the tables approved by Departmental Councils and signed by the Delegates for International Mobility according to of own course study (for LLEM & LLEA Delegates for International Mobility refer to each language area) as listed above; in order to validate exams taken at the host University, the students will have to submit to the Erasmus office of MACROAREA the original Learning Agreement.

Please note that incomplete documentation will cause a delay in the procedures for the recognition of the exam.
